
BLOCK LOTTO



Intersection Block

Background fabric: Low volume fabric

Main fabric: Any modern print or solid that contrasts with the low volume fabric

STEP ONE:


Cut a 13 inch square out of your low volume fabric.

Cut a $1 \frac{1}{2}$ inch strip x length of fabric from your main fabric.




STEP TWO:

Make a vertical cut through your background leaving at least one inch between the corner of your block and your cut. Insert your main fabric strip, sew both seams and press seams open.



STEP THREE:

Make a horizontal cut through your block leaving at least one inch between the corner of your block and your cut. Again, insert your main fabric strip, sew both seams and press seams open.



TIP Place a pin parallel to the seam as shown. This will help you align your intersection when you flip your fabric over to sew your last seam.



STEP FOUR:

Trim your block to 12.5 inches square. You're done!



GENERAL RULES:

- Blocks must be made of quilt shop quality, modern fabric.
- Blocks should be 12.5 inches square...MUST BE within 1/4 inch.
- You may make as many blocks as you'd like this month. Each block gets one entry into the drawing. There is a \$1/block entry fee paid to the guild.
- If there are more than 24 blocks, we will split the pile in half and draw 2 names
- Please label your block with your name. (You may use an address label)
- If you have previously won, you must bring your FINISHED quilt made from your winning blocks in order to be eligible to win again. You may still contribute to the pool each month, if you'd like.
