
## November 2017 Block - Another Modern Churn Dash THIS BLOCK IS SIMILAR TO THE JANUARY 2016 BLOCK LOTTO BLOCK



## Fabrics to Use:

2 color modern print with one of the colors being white Kona White (not light gray, off-white, cream, or Kona snow, please) Medium or Dark Solid

## Cutting:

One 4.5" square from the 2 color print (for center)

Eight 5" squares from the Kona White

One 3" or 4" w.o.f. strip from the Medium or Dark Solid (you may need more depending on the angle placement)

## Sewing:

Mark a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam line on the w.o.f. strip.




Lay the w.o.f. strip at an angle on one of the 5" white squares.

Make sure it will cover the corner of the white square when it is flipped up. (this is why you might need a 4" w.o.f. strip)

Sew on the line, press seam open, and trim off the excess on the back.



Press unit again.




Fussy cut to a 4.5" square. By making the piece slightly oversized, you get the chance to adjust the angle of your medium-dark fabric.

Keep in mind the 4 corners of the churn dash should have more angle than the 4 middle units. (Remember the shape of a traditional churn dash block).



Make 4 units for the corners and 4 units for the middle squares.

Try to vary the angles in size and direction.



Lay out the 9 squares to make a modern churn dash.

Check the angle of the "dashes" in each corner.

Sew together with a ¼" seam and press seams open.

Your completed block should measure 12.5" square.
