

Community Outreach

Pat S. has delivered our 30 completed Heartbeat quilts to Carle Bromenn Hospital.



10th Anniversary Improv Log Cabin blocks - we had **420** blocks turned in! That is amazing! We are doing great things for our community!

So far, **4** quilt tops have already been delivered, **9** are finished and ready for delivery, **4** tops are out to be quilted, **6** more are ready to be quilted - all from those **420** blocks. Many people

took blocks or quilt tops home from previous meetings, so hoping to see more quilt tops or completed quilts by the November meeting!

Pat S. is happy to arrange a meeting – her contact info is in the member's list - this is true for dropping off completed quilts or quilt tops. We also still have 47 blocks for those interested in making quilt tops.

We are happy to take donations of leftover fabric to add to quilt tops for negative space with the blocks. We will also accept donations of batting and backing fabric.

There will be a separate prize drawing for those that put together a quilt top out of the blocks, quilt a quilt top or bind a completed top. If you do all 3 things, you will get your name in the drawing 3 times!

Now that Pat is settling in as Vice President, we are also looking for a new Community Outreach Coordinator or Co-Coordinators. Please let a board member know if you (and a friend) are interested.

Wrapped pillow covers can be swapped in person, or mailed in order to be received in time for our Holiday Zoom on December 27th, which is a fun social zoom meeting.

- Create a modern pillow cover for a 16" X 16" pillow form.
 - Great time to try out a new technique or expand on a technique that you love. Please use at least one of the following Modern Quilting techniques:
 - the use of bold colors and prints
 - high contrast and graphic areas of solid color
 - Have fun creating!

- improvisational piecing
- minimalism
- expansive negative space
- alternate grid work

This is an opportunity to use techniques used in David Owen Hasting's workshop that is happening on December 3rd or to use techniques learned over the past year with the Modern Mystery.

Maybe you already know that some of your Modern Mystery blocks won't be part of your final quilt – they would make a great pillow cover!

This month I am going to highlight Kathy Cook. Kathy remembers watching her grandmother quilt and simultaneously thinking to herself that is not something she'd like to do but, when her first child was born she decided to make her first quilt. She didn't seriously get into quilting until about 15 years ago. She actually bought some prints which barely got any use and in fact they still remain part of her stash.

Kathy's creativity comes from within, her artistic background and her love for color and solids. She has never used a pattern but has a great respect for traditional quilters who can follow one. Her most admired quilt designer is Irene Roderick. In fact, the quilt she is most proud of and expresses her inner quilter the most is one Kathy created and made while taking a class with Irene. She credits Irene for pushing her beyond her comfort level. The quilt "Everybody Dance Now" is pictured here.

Kathy is so grateful for BNMQG, each of it's members and the fact that she lives in a community that has the only Modern Guild in Illinois outside of Chicago.

Congratulations Modern Mystery Participants! Challenges 1 - 11 have now been revealed and to date (11/17/22),

- ✓ you have posted 813 photos and more will be posted by the time you receive this newsletter.
- √ 331 additional inspiration quilt photos have been posted.
- ✓ 26 BNMQG Modern Mystery Zooms have taken place with over 550 in person attendees.
- √ 63 people have completed challenges.
- √ 190 bonus challenge units have been completed.
- ✓ At the end of challenge #10, 79.64% of all challenges have been completed and I have a feeling this number will continue to rise as we approach the February deadline.
- √ 13 of the 63 people (20.63%) have completed ALL 11 challenges as of today!
- ✓ Grand Prize is \$340.00 and winner will be drawn at the February BNMQG meeting.

We will have one more zoom in December that will include design basics and ideas. That zoom will take place at our original times on Monday, December 5th. Bring your ideas, your design wall and/or photos of your design wall with your units, and any questions you have. Remember that you can add one more fabric as a background (if you want) as you begin to design. So, mark your calendars and I hope to see you on zoom on December 5th!

IMPORTANT BNMQG Modern Mystery dates:

- November 28 Challenge 11 is due
- November 29 Challenge 11 prize drawing will take place at the BNMQG Nov. meeting
- December 5 Designing your quilt zoom
- December 27 BNMQG Christmas Party zoom, pillow swap, and one BONUS prize drawing for Mystery participants who have completed all 11 challenges by this date.
- February 15 All 11 of your challenges must be complete/posted, you must have a quilt top complete
 with a photo of your entire top (or finished quilt) posted in the MYSTERY Challenge Quilt Tops album
 to be entered into the cash drawing.
- March 27 If you want to submit your quilt to be considered to be displayed in the Decatur Art Museum exhibit, you must FINISH your mystery quilt (quilted and faced/bound). You must post the following 3-4 photographs: a) one high quality photo of the entire quilt, b) one or two detailed shots, and c) a photo of your completed label (which includes a minimum of your name, the title of your quilt and size). These photos should be put in the FINISHED Quilts album by March 28th. Note: It is not required to have completed all of the challenges or have met the Feb.15th deadline to submit your finished quilt for this exhibit.
