

## How to make a 4" Hanging Quilt Sleeve

Make a sleeve to make it easy to hang at home or at a quilt show. Sleeves are meant to be put on a pole so that it will hang flat with no bulge where the pole goes through the sleeve and that's why it has a "D" shape. The most common sleeves are 4" when they are finished. You'll start with a piece of fabric that is 8 1/2" strip of fabric x the width of your quilt.

Only want a 2" sleeve?

For a 2" finished sleeve, make the following changes –

cut your sleeve fabric to be 4 1/2" **by the exact width of your quilt** and follow the directions above.
