Kona Minis Facts and Figures

- BNMQG started this challenge in 2018. 21 people completed minis that year.
- Our 1st and 2nd mini "quilt shows" took place at Kelly's Bakery (later known as Scouts) in downtown Bloomington.
- Kona Colors in past challenges and number of completed challenges: 2018 Tiger Lily (21 quilts), 2019 Splash (23 quilts), 2020 Enchanted (16 quilts), 2021 Horizon (26 quilts), 2022 Cosmos (42 quilts!), 2023 Crush (35 quilts) and 2024 Julep (65 members have signed up).
- From 2018-2023, 73 different members have completed 163 Kona minis. Four members have completed a mini each of the 6 years Marilyn Beal, Kathy Cook, Nancy Powell, and Betty Woodruff.
- Our minis have been exhibited at:
 - Modern Quilt Showcase (2021-2023) Mattoon Arts Council Outdoor Quilt Shows
 - Modern Quilt Showcase (2021-2023) HAAQG quilt shows
 - Modern Quilt Showcase 2021-2022 Original Sewing and Quilt Expos around the U.S.
 - Modern Quilt Showcase Decatur Arts Council Anne Lloyd Gallery, August 2023
 - Modern Quilt Showcase 2024-2025 Original Sewing and Quilt Expos currently traveling around the U.S.
- The minis were featured in an article in QuiltFolk Magazine, Illinois Edition during the Pandemic and also on a Quiltfolk calendar.
- Some of the minis have been shown (and some have been awarded ribbons) at various quilt shows such as QuiltCon, Great Wisconsin Quilt Show, Quilt Show at the Mill in NJ, Paducah Quilt Show, Heart of Illinois Fair, and possibly others.



2024 BNMQG Retreat

- When: October 11, 2024 (noon) October 14, 2024 (1:00 pm)
- Where: Holiday Inn and Suites near the Airport
- **Cost:** \$175 (You may pay the entire amount or make a \$75 deposit by the June BNMQG meeting, and the balance is due by the August BNMQG meeting.)





The <u>link to the Signup Genius</u> will arrive in your email via <u>BNMQGretreat@gmail.com</u> on May 31 around noon, but it will not be active until 10 am on June 1. Please make sure this email address (<u>BNMQGretreat@gmail.com</u>) is in your contacts so that you will receive this email. There will be a limited number of seats in this retreat. However, there will be a waitlist if this retreat sells out. Seats that become available will be filled in the order of the signup on the Signup Genius. (Last year everyone on the waitlist did get a seat in the retreat, but there are no guarantees!)

The cost of the retreat is \$175 and includes three dinners (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday), swag bags, mini projects, and a sewing space for four days. Each participant will have a 6 or 8-foot table to work on. Power towers will be available at each group of tables, and you may bring your own. Cutting tables with cutting mats and ironing boards will be available. Feel free to bring your favorite sewing chair, sewing machine, projects to work on, snacks to share and a reusable, closeable cup for beverages. Water and shared snacks will be available in the sewing room. Coffee will be available in the lobby.

There will be a link to make reservations for rooms at the Holiday Inn if you choose to stay there during the retreat. The link will be found on the page with the signups.

NOTE: Your BNMQG membership must be renewed by the September meeting to keep your seat in the retreat.


Block Study by Sheila Robles


tutorial for using the <u>swath tool</u>. These and other EQ8 lessons are available on the <u>Member Page Tech Corner</u>.

Book Thoughts by Jamie Willis



Contemporary Patchwork Techniques in Colour, Surface Design & Sewing by Arounna Khounnoraj Stash Books, CT Publishing, 2023

Arounna Khounnoraj is a textile artist and maker living in Toronto, Canada. She and her husband, John Booth, cofounded Bookhau, a multi-disciplinary studio where Arounna works with surface design and textile art. This book delves into natural dyes that create a rich and subtle color palette on linen and cotton along with basic information for surface design techniques to create your unique and personal palette. We all have colors that we are drawn to and Arounna encourages us to experiment until we find

our color voice. She encourages us to keep our hand-dyed or commercial fabrics displayed in our sewing areas for inspiration and to experiment with watercolors to develop a palette for a project prior to purchasing and cutting fabric. All those blank paper sketchbooks now have a use.

This book is a great choice for some small projects to tackle this summer. The colors are inspiring and her easy-to-follow dyeing and printing instructions are meant for all skill levels. Included are 10 great, small projects that will inspire you to get your improv, modern groove on! My two personal favorites are the Japanese rice bag and the printed whole cloth quilt. Both seem attainable when we are summertime-busy and want to make some patchwork, hand stitch and start something small.

So get your glass of ice tea and be inspired to do some summer dyeing, printing, and improv piecing.

Paducah Show

Congratulations to Leslie Swearinger and Judy Zoelzer Levine who both had quilts accepted into the Paducah Quilt show.

Leslie had three quilts accepted and displayed in Paducah. Her first quilt, *Improvitude*, was shown in the large quilt category. It previously showed in Daytona in February. Leslie's second quilt, *Flamingo Frenzy*, was shown in the modern category. *Roundabout*, her third quilt, was shown in the mini category. *Roundabout* was the mini quilt she created for BNMQG Kona Crush challenge in 2023. It also showed last year at The Great Wisconsin Quilt Show.

Judy had two quilts displayed in Paducah: *Dragon Moons* and *City: Reflections*. Judy was inspired to add dragons to *Dragon Moons* after binge watching *Game of Thrones*. She found the perfect dragons in public domain clipart. Dragon Moons measures 35 ½" wide x 35 ¼" high. City: Reflections measures 30" x 41" and was made from decorator sample book swatches that were raw edge appliquéd. She explained, "I wasn't happy with the design until I sliced and shifted a section. Voila! A city appeared."
